Riding Skills and Fitness Test at NHC – day tbc end of May/early June

The Stewards of The British Horseracing Authority have granted exemptions from the effects of Rule 204 (ii)(6) for this race as it is being run outside the Rules of Racing therefore it will not count for any purpose on the horse's career record.

Race Conditions

- 1mile 1furlong Flat Race
- Maximum field of 12
- Minimum weight to be carried 11st 7lbs, maximum weight 12st
- For horses 3 years old and upwards, currently in training, who must have run at least 3 times under the recognised Rules of Racing
- Entry Fee Riders pledge to raise at least £4,000 to be donated to Macmillan Cancer Support.
- The rider will only be eligible to ride if they pass both their Riding and Fitness Assessment Courses as outlined below.
- The Charity Race is run outside the 'Rules of Racing' and will take place 1 hour before the first flat race race of the afternoon at approximately 1pm.

Rules

Application form to be signed by a licensed trainer to say they will vouch for your competence in the saddle, allow you to ride out, and assist in sourcing an appropriate horse for you to ride in the race.

A long list of 14 riders will be invited to attend the Northern Horseracing College to have an independent riding assessment in the indoor school and an introduction to the fitness test that will be taken in late May/early June.

There will also be a sandwich lunch and the opportunity to meet your dedicated Macmillan Fundraiser and members of the York team, who will be helping you in your challenge. York Racecourse will pay for this course.

Twelve riders will be then be chosen and notified by December 1st 2023 with two reserves. The places are offered at the discretion of York Racecourse on the advice of the Jockey Coaches at NHC, whose aim is to deliver a safe race and raise donations for Macmillan Cancer Support. York Racecourse's decision on the selected twelve is final.

Successful riders are required to meet the sponsorship targets listed below. York Racecourse reserves the right to withdraw a rider's place if it feels that the rider is not able to raise the target sponsorship for Macmillan Cancer Support. Their place will be offered to a reserve rider.

Forfeit Stages for Sponsorship

Riders pledge to raise at least £4,000 sponsorship to be banked with Macmillan Cancer Support or on justgiving.com in the following stages:

- A minimum of £1,000 by 1st February 2024
- A minimum of a further £1,000 by 1st March 2024
- A minimum of a further £1,000 by 1st April 2024
- A minimum of a further £1,000 by 1st May 2024

Compulsory Requirements

- Minimum age of rider 18 years. Maximum age of rider 70 years. Ages as on raceday.
- Riders are to wear skullcaps and body protectors as under the Rules of Racing, and which conform to the following minimum standard;

Body Protector – Level 2, EN 13158 2018 or Level 3

Helmet – PAS 015 2011 or 2012

Whips to be carried but not used for encouragement.

- All riders who are confirmed to ride in the race must ensure they participate in and pass a one day Riding Skills and Fitness Assessment course at the National Horseracing College. The course is designed to assess a rider's competence and fitness and prepare them for the experience of riding in a race. The date will be advised on notification of successful application, and will be funded by York Racecourse. Any rider who fails either course will not be allowed to ride in the race, and the decision of the Jockey Coach/Assessor is final.
- All riders should be responsible for their own insurance. It is recommended that you become a member of the Amateur Jockeys Association, which will, on payment of your subscription, give you world wide riding out insurance, as part of the membership benefits. On acceptance into the race, it is the riders' responsibility to source a horse in training suitable for the race and make all necessary arrangements for the day of the race.

- All horses must be currently in training with a licensed trainer and vaccinated in accordance with Rule 35 of the Rules of Racing. Each Horse must be accompanied by an up-to-date Horse Passport and EI vaccinations must conform with current BHA protocols.
- York Racecourse will have the final decision on all applicants' eligibility to ride in the Macmillan Ride of Their Lives.
- Each declared runner will be entitled to six complimentary Owners' badges for the owner of the horse, and lunches. In addition, the rider will receive four badges to include themselves and their supporters. Any further badges for family and friends should be purchased in the normal way.

Following your race, all riders and their three guests will be invited to a private box with a celebratory glass of Champagne to celebrate your achievement. This will be followed by a 3 course lunch with wine, and afternoon tea, whilst you enjoy the remainder of the days flat racing.

Successful applicants will also receive the following;

- A prize for the rider who raises the most sponsorship money.
- Mementoes to all jockeys and a prize for the winner.
- Branded jackets.
- A member of the Macmillan fundraising team will be on hand throughout for practical help and support.
- Invitation to a social event to be specified at a later date, for each rider and a guest, to celebrate their achievement
