As we finally bring this most unusual of race seasons to a close, I am writing to thank you sincerely for your continued support of York Racecourse after a year none of us could have envisaged, nor wished for. Your attendance on the Knavesmire has been hugely missed and I am so sorry that Government restrictions meant we were not able to welcome you to York Racecourse this year.

The bitter irony is that we have hosted some tremendous racing action on the track behind closed doors with the audience watching at home – with standout performances by Ghaiyyath, Love, Battaash and Fujaira Prince in our flagship races at the Welcome to Yorkshire Ebor Festival, as well as many other horses who have ran well at York and elsewhere. Indeed, it looks possible our flagship race, the Juddmonte International, will be again rated amongst the very best races in the world in the year end rankings. I hope you have managed to follow the racing action on television, our digital channels and with our digital racecards.

I wanted to reiterate what we said earlier in the season - we will "roll over" your annual badge to the 2021 season, with no further payment required ahead of next season. Your 2020 badge is destined to become a unique curio and our plan is to despatch the new 2021 badge in the spring ahead of the Dante Festival 2021, all being well.

No-one has a crystal ball as to the situation in mid May 2021, however we remain positive and hope for a more normal season and to be able to welcome you for all 18 racedays. The provisional dates are on our website. We will update you if there is a change to the prospects for 2021.
